1. About your organisation / the work you do

Who can apply?

✓ Must primarily benefit the Wellington region

✓ Must have a charitable purpose – this usually means you have either charitable or incorporated society status. Unsure of your status? call us to discuss

Our region Te Upoko o te Ika Kāpiti Coast (incl. Ōtaki) Porirua Upper Hutt Wellington Lower Hutt

We don't fund:

- × Retrospectively
- × Central or local government
- x Commercial ventures (We do fund social enterprise)
- × Endowments, Capital Funds, and other Trust Funds holding investments
- x Core healthcare services, including primary and secondary health services
- × Individuals, including scholarships and organisations that provide individual scholarships
- × Promotion of a religious or political message (We do fund faith-based community services)
- Schools (including universities, childcare centres & kindergartens) and organisations who fund-raise primarily for schools
- × Medical procedures and treatment (including screening, diagnosis, and vaccination); medical equipment; medical research; professional respite care
- × Any other exclusions as approved by the Trustees

(In some circumstances exclusions may differ for specific funds or initiatives)

Applications should meet at least one of these criteria:

General Grants (up to \$50,000):

- ✓ Increase community self-determination
- ✓ Meet immediate community need
- ✓ Increase access and inclusion for those who experience disadvantage and exclusion
- ✓ Increase preservation and protection of natural spaces

2. Who your grant is going to benefit

We prioritise funding to applications that:

- √ support equity* and inclusion in our communities
 - *Equity = people have what they need to survive and succeed access to opportunity, resources, networks, and support, that enable them to thrive. 'Everyone is welcome' is not the same as 'this service/programme has been designed for priority population groups'.
- ✓ Serve/are designed for, and are led by, members of these population groups:
 - ✓ Māori
 - ✓ Pacific Peoples
 - ✓ Middle Eastern, Latin American, African
 - ✓ Youth and Children
- ✓ Serve/are designed for, and are led by, people who are part of communities living in these locations:
 - ✓ Ōtaki
 - ✓ Lower Hutt
 - ✓ Porirua

Why these groups?

Research shows us that these populations experience the most inequity. However, we acknowledge that our research is not one point of truth, and we welcome applications for initiatives that support advancement of equity.

WCF Recommends: Make sure you can show us that your project/programme has been designed for members of population groups experiencing inequity.

3. The process

What do I need to do?

- 1. Firstly, make sure you are eligible by reading about our criteria and exclusions.
- 2. You will need to be registered on our online grants portal (Fluxx) https://wellingtoncommunityfund.fluxx.io/

WCF Recommends: All grant-seekers need their own individual profile in our online grants portal (Fluxx). If you need help with registering, or remembering your login details, please call or email us.



- 3. Once registered on our Fluxx site, fill in and submit our online application form.
- General Grants application questions
- LIFT Grants application questions

WCF Recommends: If you are new to funding, a first time applicant with us, or asking for more than \$10k, it's a good idea to have a quick chat with one of our team before you register or submit an application.

What documents do I need to provide?

- 1. A project budget
- 2. Proof of your bank account
- 3. Recent financial reporting/accounts

When will I find out if I'm successful?

We don't have funding rounds; we assess applications as they come in. Decisions for larger grants require board approval and therefore take longer, because the Board meets approx. every 6 weeks.

- For grants up to \$10k expect a decision with several weeks
- For grants over \$10k expect a decision within several months

What reporting do I need to provide?

At the end of your granting period we will ask you to fill in a very short outcome report; just a few questions about how the project went and if anything changed. This is also an opportunity to share photos and other interesting information with us.
